We met at Library 21C –to learn important information regarding cameras, lenses, Bayer sensors, chips, lighting, lenses, tripods, and other equipment like Goreit flashlights—comparing quality and prices.

This was an extraordinary power point presentation and discussion, often guided by questions from the audience. Bill included concepts about full frame / half frame cameras and references to mirrorless cameras and Go Pros. Several times he referenced the <u>B & H website</u> for buying camera gear and accessories. Seventeen (17) people attended, including three (3) new guests.
