PRINTS FOR CHILDREN PROJECT

After our last meeting, some PDIS Members asked me about this gallery show scheduled for **July** at the Children's Library, Library 21C. We will meet in **June for a workshop** at the Academy Art & Frame Co. (AAFC) to mount our 14 x 11 or 11 x 14 color prints on butcher paper.

These prints must be in color with children's themes: nature and wildlife, pets, sports, transportation, etc. PLEASE – no landscapes, no black and white. We will mount them on butcher paper. They will be pinned to cork board strips in the library. We need approximately 100 prints – minimum of 15 artists. Consider them donated. Additional details TBD.

We will attach a letter to the back of each print for foster children at Hope & Home. After hanging them at the library (July – September), we will transfer them to the director at Hope & Home during our October "Final Approach" Meeting.

Kim Costello at AAFC offered us workshop table time for mounting our prints: Tuesday, **June 4**, and Thursday, **June 6**. We need at least four (4) members to mount images--preferably six (6) members.
